Connect Burlingtonians with new job opportunities by preparing our young people, working families and New Americans for jobs in the growing tech sector and construction industry. We need to welcome private investment, and we need to make it work for us.

Build a community where seniors thrive. Waiting lists for senior housing are too long. We need to help seniors maintain their independence, and support families who care for aging parents. We can ease the process to add accessory units within single-family homes.



Restore the role of our neighborhoods in planning their own future. We can reinvigorate our Neighborhood Planning Assemblies by empowering them with a greater role in setting our city's priorities.

Restore trust and rebuild relationships in our schools, and focus on how to best prepare our kids for the future. The success of our schools is important to the success of our city. We need to protect against increasing property taxes here in Burlington by advocating for improving our education financing system, and for adequate education funding from the state.
